Message from our Vice Chairman, Mrs. Sandra Shroff

This year, we conducted an Impact Assessment Study of our CSR initiatives. The results are very encouraging, both at the macro level and micro level. Farmers in Dangs are not only growing more through the SRI project, they are also eating more nutritious meals through the BoriBagicha. Rural women are not only earning more, they are taking their own decisions. The youth in the region, who did not have any employable skills, got trained and are earning their own bread today and many have become entrepreneurs. Young women have become skilled and passionate caretakers (nurses) and are providing care with love to the patients. Children in rural schools today know that washing hands is important before and after eating. They are using dustbins to throw garbage and are using toilets today.

We have defined our focus area for work in order to bring more focus, but this is not restrictive. We look at the overall need and strength of the community and plan accordingly. So last year, we built a hostel for the tribal school children in Kaprada, Valsad. Now children have a good quality residential facility and they can focus on studies. We went to Vandri to work with the people there. Vandri is one of the remotest villages in Narmada district and the improvement of community is visible. It was important to take this challenge and bring about change.

This year, the CSR team initiated the Social Forestry Program and planted 48,736 saplings in 116.72 acres of community land across 5 locations in Ankleshwar, Jhagadia and Vagra block. Apart from the saplings, we also constructed borewells, set up solar system water pumps and micro irrigation systems to ensure continuous irrigation and thereby growth of the plants. We are ready to plant 1,20,000 mangrove plants spread across 60 acres of land in Vagra block.

We believe in synergy and are constantly working with other organizations that bring value. Global Parli Project is doing tremendous work under the visionary leadership of Mr. Mayank Gandhi.

My WAU volunteers need much appreciation for all the valuable work they do for the community. It is not easy to take out time from our busy schedules and do community work. This year they gave more than 3800 hours of service which speaks volumes about their commitment.

We see change everywhere we go. The community is becoming more and more aware and is actively participating and contributing to all the development programs. We don't want people to be dependent on UPL for all their growth and development needs. We want a self-reliant community that works for its own growth and development!

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

Skill Development Initiative: Niyojaniy Kendra

Average monthly income of youth in the region increased from ₹ 4,750 to ₹ 7,750 after getting trained from the Centre and getting gainfully employed.



Shroff S Rotary Institute of Chemical Technology (SRICT), Vataria, Ankleshwar

The average monthly income of an SRICT graduate engineer is ₹ 28,053 (1st five years of placement) which is 58% more than any other engineering graduate in the region.

Women members experience enhanced self-reliance, self-expression and advocacy. (100% of the women have advocated the program to others and have successfully enrolled more women in to SHGs).

1.0 AGRICULTURE DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES UPL Khedut Pragati

Small land holdings, use of traditional farming techniques, high dependence on rain-fed irrigation, low use of technology etc. have made Indian agriculture a not-so-profitable venture for the farmers, often forcing them to live a poor quality life, sans hope for growth and development. UPL Ltd. is working with the farmers to bring a change in this status quo!

Sustainable Livelihood from Agriculture

UPL Ltd.'s agri interventions focus on making farming a sustainable and profitable venture for the farmers through the following:

- Increase in per acre yield of Paddy
- Reduction in cost of production
- Better natural resource management

Based on the SRI principle, we have undertaken 2 programs. One is called UPL AKRSP SRI Project, which is implemented in partnership with Aga Khan Rural Support Program. Farmers are trained in SRI technology and quality input (seeds and fertilizers) are provided at the appropriate time. Exposure visits to other SRI farms also help in improving their understanding of the technology.

This initiative was started in the year 2012 and has been instrumental in improving the financial prospects of 1500 farmers in Dang.

A new beginning for Suresh Gaeen

Life was no bed of roses for Suresh Gaeen, a farmer from Divdiyavan village in Waghai Taluka, where he lives with his family (wife and 2 children). Suresh's family lived on a meagre annual income of ₹ 48,000 which was derived from farming on his 3 acres land and the 2 buffalos and 4 cows he had. Suresh, like other farmers in his village was growing Paddy in the traditional method which consumed 8-10 kg seeds per acre of land. The cost of weeding and fertilizers were also high. With the average production per acre being 700 kgs, farming was not a very profitable proposition for Suresh. However, like many other farmers in Dang, Suresh had resigned to his fate, till the date he attended a meeting on SRI technology organized by the UPL team. Suresh recalls how he got introduced to the SRI technology and the finer nuances of growing more Paddy per acre of land.

Multiple training sessions at the UPL Center for Agriculture Excellence, meetings with officials and exposure visits to other SRI farms opened the door for him. He recalls that the SRI booklet and Amritpani pamphlets by AKRSP (India) team were really helpful. The financial support from UPL further paved the way for Suresh to adopt the SRI technology.

With the new technology, Suresh saw 35-40 tillers per plant which was much more than the traditional method. The seed requirement also reduced by 40% thereby decreasing the cost of production. Suresh mentions that weeding has also become easier with the cono –weeder. At the same time, production of Paddy grain increased to a whopping 1250 kg per acre (which was 550 kg more than the traditional method). The size of the grain was better which fetched him a better price (Increase of INR 25 per 20 kg of grain).

Suresh feels proud that other farmers in his village look up to him as a progressive farmer and pay him more respect now. The increase in purchasing capacity has helped in making life more comfortable for Suresh and his family. Suresh and hundreds of other farmers who have adopted the SRI technology are living a better quality of life today!

Our agri intervention strives to build the capacity of the farmers through the following:

- Dissemination of knowledge and best practices
- Application of lab technology to farmers' land
- Promoting allied activities (ex- animal husbandry)
- Institutional and infrastructural support

All the agricultural interventions are driven by the farmers' group known as **UPL Pragati Sheel Farmers Group.**Orientation programs, exposure visits and training are organized keeping in mind the interest of these groups.

THE BACKBONE OF THE CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAM IS THE FARMERS' TRAINING CENTRE NOW KNOWN AS UPL CENTRE FOR AGRICULTURE EXCELLENCE. THIS CENTRE WAS STARTED IN THE YEAR 2000 AND WAS EARLIER KNOWN AS UPL KHEDUT NIYOJANIY KENDRA (VIKRAM FARM), TRAININGS ARE ORGANISED THROUGHOUT THE YEAR FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE FARMERS. In 2016-17, 22 training programs were organized, benefitting 623 farmers.

Till date, more than 13,000 farmers have benefitted from the various training and exposure visits at the UPL Center for Agriculture Excellence. Looking at the needs of the training programs, we constructed a new training centre at the farm, well-equipped with all modern amenities.

Vandri Cluster development project: Walking the last mile...

Vandri is a never-heard-of land for many, even in the district where it is located (Narmada). Being one of the remotest villages in the district, Vandri is cut off from the world. With hardly any infrastructural facilities, health centre or supporting institutions, Vandri is a land where no development has dared to take place. 100% of its inhabitants belong to the Scheduled Tribe and are completely dependent on rain-fed agriculture for sustenance. However, the village topography is unsuitable for farming; the average rainfall in the region is 1100 mm on an average. Water management systems are non-existent and hence water cannot be stored for irrigation. The production of milk is also very low and only suffices the family's requirement. The quality of life in Vandri is very grim. For the survival of their families, farmers are forced to migrate to neighboring cities for sustenance.

UPL LTD. HAS DECIDED TO WALK THIS LAST MILE AND REACH OUT TO THE RESIDENTS OF VANDRI TO MAKE LIFE BETTER FOR THEM. WE STARTED WITH COMMUNITY MEETINGS, UNDERSTANDING THE NEEDS AND STRENGTHS OF THE VILLAGERS, PRIORITIZING THEM AND FORMING COMMUNITY BASED ORGANIZATIONS TO CARRY FORWARD THE DEVELOPMENT TASK.



The following areas were identified for intervention:

- Water Resource Development and Management
 - ▶ Building Check Dams, Nala plugging and Bori bund
 - ▶ Stone bunding, Farm bund etc.
- Land development through land leveling and improving the fertility of soil
- Agriculture Development
 - ▶ Provide better quality agri-inputs like seeds, fertilizers etc.
 - ▶ Provide knowledge and skills through training, exposure visits, demonstrations etc.
- Formation of community-based organizations like Farmers Group, Women SHG, Youth Group
- Promotion of Micro irrigation system

We have already completed the following work in Vandri:

- One check dam has been built
- Two group wells were constructed
- Land leveling has been done in the field of 25 farmers

Improved Nutrition for the Farmers and their Families

A majority of the agriculture interventions focus on improving the productivity of land, neglecting the gloomy state of farmer's health and nutrition. UPL Ltd. took up this challenge to improve the nutritional value of farmer's meals along with improving land productivity.

Dang Moringa Development Program and UPL BoriBagicha is a step in this direction.

Moringa (commonly known as Drumstick in English) is a vegetable with the highest nutritional value among many types of food. It is a great source of vitamins A, C, iron, potassium, protein and calcium. We distribute high-quality Moringa seeds to interested farmers and help them with the plantation. Various meetings are conducted where the benefits of eating Moringa are taught.

Similarly, we promote plantation of **BoriBagicha** and Kitchen gardens. BoriBagicha is a technology where vegetable plants are grown in plastics bags requiring minimum space. These light weight bags are portable and hence very convenient for kitchen gardening.

This program has a twin objective of supplementing nutritional value of tribal homes in Dangs and slowly becoming an alternate source of income too! Seeds of vegetables (belonging to the Cucurbita family having high nutritional value) are distributed to the farmers and training is imparted on the upkeep of the kitchen garden.

2.0 EMPLOYABILITY AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP

In the absence of quality education and employable skills, a majority of the working population gets into unskilled employment for sustenance. The quality of life remains low due to the low-income levels. Women face multiple socio-cultural boundaries which limit their choice for financial independence and growth.

Employability Interventions (Our Approach)

Sustainable Livelihood

Promoting sustainable livelihoods is a coherent and integrated approach to improving the quality of life of the rural youth and women. Our programs aim at providing ecologically, economically and socially sustainable opportunities.





Capacity Building

Our capacity building programs focus on developing and strengthening the skills, abilities, processes and resources which would help the community to adapt, grow and have an improved quality of life in this ever changing world (with a focus on women and youth).







Promoting Sustainable Livelihoods

Capabilities, assets and activities together form the backbone of any livelihood. To improve the capabilities of the youth in the region we have taken up various programs under the umbrella of Skill Development Initiative.



UPL Niyojaniy Kendra

S R Shroff Aajivika Trust (SRSAT) is a Non-Profit Organization promoted by UPL Ltd. The Trust has promoted and manages 4 skill development centres known as UPL Niyojaniy Kendra, in 3 districts of Gujarat namely Makarpura (Vadodara), Savli (Vadodara), Ankleshwar (Bharuch) and Halol (Panchmahal).

The word "Niyojaniy" means employable. The objective of the Kendra is to provide comprehensive skills training on industry specific skills like welding, fitting, etc. so that the participants can be successfully employed in industries. These centres offer short duration, typically 3–6 months, practically oriented programs, with a focus on Fabrication, Chemical and Electrical sectors.

A NEW LIFE FOR JAGRUTI PATEL AND COUNTLESS OTHER WOMEN!

This is the story of Jagruti Patel, who like many women in rural Gujarat are living a dignified life, thanks to the UPL Udyamita Program. Self Help Groups or SHGs have become a household name impacting the lives of women and the society at large.

Jagruti was not born with a silver spoon in her mouth, nor did she acquire much knowledge and skills during her growing years. Married to a small farmer in Kubhariya village of Pardi Taluka, Jagruti had resigned to her fate, which had given her a meagre income of ₹ 1500- 2000 per month to live on. Life was difficult till the day Jagruti got introduced to Dhyey Utkarsh Group. She came to know about the SHG concept and the benefits associated with the same. She promptly decided to become a member and in 2014 embarked on a new journey (starting with a saving of ₹ 100 per month).

Through the course of time, Jagruti became interested in starting an enterprise. She had attended many training programs on entrepreneurship (organized by UPL team) and had been on a number of exposure visits. Jagruti learned the nuances of business and decided to sell Papad (an Indian snack) which was made by her group members. She took a loan of ₹7,000 from the group and started her business. She went door-to-door selling Papad and also sold some quantity through the village shops. Jagruti realized that the profits she received in this business were not rewarding enough. So she decided to start her own manufacturing. In one of her exposure visits, Jagruti had seen a Papad making unit and she had learned the finer nuances from there. Confident of starting her own unit, Jagruti employed 2-3 SHG members too. Jagruti has displayed the traits of a good businesswoman, never compromising on quality. Villagers swear by the quality of her Papad and today she gets orders to the tune of 15-20 kgs per day. This helps her in earning a monthly income of ₹5000-8000.

Jagruti has become a confident woman now. She takes care of her business dealings, performs banking operations, gives her opinion in village meetings and is effectively contributing to the growth of other women too! Jagruti is on a path that only leads to success through hard work, dedication and confidence!

Skill Based Entrepreneurial Development Program is another capacity building Initiative which has been giving positive results.

This is a holistic program that incorporates all the components of entrepreneurial development. To improve the effectiveness of the program, we have included both technical and life skills aspects. This program provides training to set up both farm and non - farm based enterprises.



Quality of life of the natural habitat must be improved through information dissemination, increased awareness and focused efforts to preserve and protect the same.






Conserve Flora and Fauna

Sarus Conservation Project, Vadodara

Gujarat is home to a vulnerable, resident species of Cranes called Sarus Cranes. These are found in Ahmedabad, Anand, Baroda and Kheda districts. Sarus Crane (Grus Antigone), a resident species is known to use wetlands and agriculture fields and live in association with human beings. The major threat to Sarus Crane in India is habitat loss and degradation due to draining wetland and conversion for agriculture, construction of roads, housing colonies, and railway lines. More recently, many deaths have been recorded due to collision with power lines. The long-term conservation of the species that inhabits human surroundings outside protected areas requires community protection initiatives and education and awareness programs in the major breeding, foraging and roosting areas.

UPL Ltd. has decided to work on their preservation through the Sarus Conservation Project.

This project was initiated in the year 2015 with multiple objectives:

- To assess the status of Sarus Crane's presence in selected districts of Gujarat
- To identify and understand their preferred habitat
- To gauge the various threats these birds face and work towards eradicating these threats

Awareness generation amongst students and farming community

Our awareness generation program focuses on students and farming community. They are imparted information on Sarus Cranes, its habitat and importance through documentary in Gujarati. Posters, pamphlets, slide shows, lectures, posters and presentation talks are organized in the crane breeding areas. Drawing competition, spot quizzes and movie screenings are also done to spread awareness amongst the students.



Rural Sarus Protection Groups

These are community-based groups who work towards a common objective of Sarus Protection. All the conservation efforts are driven by these groups.



Activity Undertaken

Awareness generation programs:

- Bird watching trips
- Nature education camps
- Wild life week programs
- Community Meetings
- Training workshops
- Interactive sessions
- Lectures and talks
- Movie screenings
- Drawing competitions, rangoli making competitions, quizzes and more.

Output/Outcome

650 villagers (including farmers and others) from more than 20 villages have been made aware by the Initiative

This led to reporting of 15 nests from agriculture fields and successful fledging of 28 juveniles

1705 students and 89 teachers from 30 schools were made aware through these activities

Workshop for Rural Sarus Protection Groups

Output/Outcome

12 Rural Sarus Protection Groups comprising 35 volunteers were formed and trained in documentation, handling of injured birds and linked with state forest department for future support and sustainability

Surveys were undertaken in all the tehsils of Kheda and Vadodara to study distribution of Sarus crane and their nesting and breeding success

Output/Outcome

- Forty-six wetlands in Kheda, Anand and Vadodara district were documented during the surveys.
- ☐ The study documented 500 Sarus Cranes from Kheda district of Gujarat.
- Three winter congregation sites were identified. 120 Sarus Cranes were sighted in one flock in Limbasi (highest sightings till date by the team).
- Eight summer congregation (April, 2017) sites were identified. 170 Sarus Cranes were sighted at the Gobrapura Lake.
- During 2016–2017 nesting season, 26 nests were documented. 36 chicks hatched out.

Major congregation sites and important breeding sites were documented as well.

Activity Undertaken

1000 posters and 4000 leaflets were prepared in local language and Hindi for distribution during awareness programs

Output/Outcome

The community was informed about Sarus Cranes' breeding cycle, their role in agriculture, threats to the species and conservation measures to be taken for the survival and protection of the species

We celebrated the following events with much fan-fare throughout the year with the target community



Sarus in his fields and heart too!

Chhota Bhai is a farmer from Vastana village in Kheda block. He is a real life hero for the Sarus Cranes. He grows Paddy and Wheat on his land. Sarus Cranes have been regularly visiting his fields for some time now. Though Chhota Bhai never cared for the birds earlier, he didn't harm them either. It was sometime in 2015 that he got to attend some of the awareness programs conducted by UPL''s CSR team in his village. He became fascinated by the wonderful bird and decided to do something. He became a regular in all the meetings and programs on Sarus Conservation and soon became a member of the Rural Sarus Protection Group in his village.

He attended various training programs and workshops on Sarus conservation. Along with his knowledge, his love for the bird grew too. He has been instrumental in providing information on nesting's, pairs, congregation sites etc. He actively spreads awareness about the bird and convinces his fellow farmers not to disturb the breeding pairs in the nesting season. Chhota Bhai has been responsible for successful fledging of 5 juveniles from 3 nests in his farm land and others. He is a true hero indeed!



Sustainable Livelihood and Environment





UPL Social Forestry Project @ District Bharuch

Social forestry means the management and protection of forests and afforestation of barren and deforested lands with the purpose of helping in the environmental, social and rural development. The government has been trying to increase forest areas that are close to human settlement and have been degraded over the years due to human activities.

Under Social Forestry, the community is encouraged to plant trees in village common land, government wasteland and Panchayat land. Social forestry also aims at raising plantations by the common man so as to meet the growing demand for timber, fuel wood, fodder, etc., thereby reducing pressure on traditional forest areas. Social Forestry also formally recognizes the local communities' rights to forest resources and encouraging rural participation in the management of natural resources.

Through this Initiative, UPL Ltd. aims to involve community participation, as part of a drive towards afforestation and rehabilitating the degraded forest and common lands.

Social Forestry in Ankleshwar, Jhagadia and Vagra block

UPL Ltd is working with the Gram Panchayat in the above mentioned areas for social forestry project in the community land which has not been used for long. In this project, we are constructing bore wells, setting up solar system water pumps and micro irrigation systems to ensure continuous irrigation and thereby growth of the plants. A MOU has been signed with the community regarding the upkeep and management of the forest.

5.0 HEALTH AND SANITATION

Poor hygiene and sanitation practices are a leading cause of declining health condition in the country. The situation is no better in the areas where we operate, where a majority of the population does not have access to clean and usable toilet facilities. The situation gets even more grim, owing to the cultural barriers which prevent adopting new practices.



To provide adequate health care facilities at an affordable



To improve school and community environment (safe, hygienic and healthy) through increased access to sanitation (toilet) and increased use of the same.





Adequate Health Care Facilities

In order to provide good quality health care facilities especially to the less privileged people in the region, we have instituted and are managing 2 hospitals.

Haria L.G. Rotary Hospital, Vapi

The Rotary Hospital at Vapi is a 250 bed Multi specialty Hospital and is considered as one of the best, well-equipped, professionally managed and well-maintained hospitals in the region. The hospital is equipped with fully functional operation theatres, has trauma and emergency centre, blood bank, dialysis centre, physiotherapy centre and much more. The primary measure of success at the hospital is delivering benchmark quality of medical services by responsive, caring and efficient people with a never-ending focus on service and medical excellence.

Improved Sanitation Environment

We understand that an improved sanitation environment will necessarily require a 3 pronged approach and hence we work on the following under our...

UPL School Sanitation Program

1. Build excellent quality toilets in schools (equipped with proper drainage facility, availability of water and proper cleaning mechanism)





2. Generate adequate awareness amongst the school students and the community about the immense benefits of using toilet vis-a-vis open defecation



3. Make the community aware about hygiene practices (use of dustbins, washing hands, drainage system in village etc.)

15 toilet blocks have been built in 2016-17 in various schools across Valsad, Ankleshwar, Halol and Jammu benefitting more than 3000 students who have been regularly using the facility since then.

(24 toilet blocks have been built in schools in the last 2 years)

Similarly, 2 toilet blocks have been built at the railway station in Valsad benefitting around 3000 commuters every day.

Last year, we initiated a home safety program too. Our programs work towards spreading safety measures in order to prevent and avoid untoward accidents.

SOME SELF-DEFENCE **TECHNIQUES ARE ALSO** TAUGHT IN THE PROGRAM.

Girl Safety Training



Road/Highway Safety Training

We understand that a lack of awareness about road safety rules is the prime cause of road accidents. A majority of the accidents can be prevented by creating awareness about road safety measures. Participants are made aware of traffic rules and associated measures to prevent accidents.

Industrial Safety Training

The training program aims at promoting good actions and initiatives that would improve overall safety of the industrial workspaces and contribute to the well-being of the workers and the environment. We focus on the use of safety equipments, do's and dont's in a manufacturing unit and measures to take in case of an accident.

Home Safety Training

Global Parli Project

Global Parli is a pilot project of providing 360-degree development to 15 villages in Parli tehsil (Distict- Beed) in Marathawada. The primary goal is to increase the per capita income of each family by 250% in 3 years.



This project is being implemented by "Global Parli" team under the leadership of Mr. Mayank Gandhi.

Gram Swaraj

The community has been actively involved in working for their common cause of deepening and widening of rivers. Village administration has improved by leaps and bounds since the government officials like a veterinary doctor, Talati, Gram Sewaks etc. have started coming regularly after our intervention.

Water Management

The key to the development of this area is the rejuvenation of the 32.5 km Paapnashi river. This river and its tributaries pass through almost all the 15 villages. The river has to be cleared of all obstructions, deepened and broadened. Work has started to clear the obstructions.





Economy

10 families each from the 15 villages were given one month old chicks to supplement the income of the poorest families in the villages. Camps have been organized to promote banking practices and online transactions. 70% people have opened accounts and have already started transactions. Women from 15 villages have received orders to stitch bags for corporates, including UPL Ltd.

Human Development

5 schools have been selected for comprehensive school up-gradation program – all aspects including infrastructure, e-learning, teachers, additional teaching etc. are included. Health camps have been organized with the distribution of health cards and free medicines. A one- year intensive training of youth on agri-entrepreneurship was organised. To promote the culture of sports amongst the youth, multiple initiatives were undertaken. A wrestling pit (akhada) has been restarted in Waghala to promote the sport, a 5 km marathon race was organized for the youth and a football tournament was organized for all 15 villages.





Support to Trusts and Institutions for Nation Building

UPL Ltd. provided financial support to various Institutions and Trusts which are playing a key role in nation building in various areas. The key amongst them are:

Pimpri Chinchwad Education Trust (PCET) was established by Late Shri. Shankarrao B. Patil in the year 1990 with a vision to provide a value-added educational platform to society, in multiple dimensions, right from Nursery to Doctoral programs in all professional streams, enabling students to achieve freedom through Education.

Jawahar Medical Foundation, Dhule was registered in the year 1984 to cater to the needs of the people of the Dhule region. The first major achievement was in 1989, when a charitable general hospital was set up to look after the health needs of the rural population of Dhule district. Initially, the hospital had only 150 beds, and was run on the no-loss-no-profit basis. In 1989 the foundation started an urban health centre inside the Dhule city, at Lane no. 4 and another rural health center at Village Mundalwad in Dhadgaon Taluka (an Adivasi area). Thereafter, activities of the foundation picked up fast.

Dr. Aabaji Thatte Sewa Aur Anusandhan Sanstha, a Charitable Trust, registered under Bombay Public Trust Act 1860 established in 1996 with the sole aim of alleviating the sufferings of people with various medical illnesses, has been serving the society for more than a decade. Recognizing the emergence of Cancer as a major health problem on an epidemic scale in our country, the managing committee decided to establish state-of-art facilities for diagnosis, prevention and treatment of cancers. Nagpur, the medical hub of central India was selected to host such facilities. As an initial step, a unique facility, Centre for Preventive Oncology and Palliative Cancer Care is dedicated to service cancer patients on 19th August 2012, in response to the immediate need in the two areas of cancer prevention and rapidly increasing need of multi-disciplinary palliative care for patients with advanced cancers.



7.0 THE COMPLIMENTARY EDUCATION PROGRAM CSR Initiative in Brazil



Program Background



Target Group



Our Partner

The program is undertaken in challenging localities with people belonging to low socio-economic status, living in areas with poor infrastructure, less or no access to sanitation, health, education, cultural activities or leisure. This socio-economic background exposes the youth to child prostitution, domestic violence and idleness which could lead them to the dangerous world of marginality.

Teenagers around the age of 13 years, who are exposed to psycho-social vulnerability; located in regions of extreme deprivation; attending the 7th or 8th grade in public schools with at least 75% attendance and belonging to low-income families with per capita income not exceeding half of the minimum wage, those who are residents of poor communities where the program is working.

The Association Life is a Non-Governmental Organization (non-profit) that believes in the power of education to change the world in which we live, by forming the agents of that change. Through educational activities, Association Life promotes the development of social and educational skills of underprivileged youth so that they can start working as creative, responsible and competent entrepreneurs.

The Complementary Education Program aims to provide the adolescents access to:

- The most appropriate colleges in preparing for college entrance exams
- Competitions for technical colleges
- Extra-curricular courses
- Medical and psychological care
- Respecting and understanding the needs of one another



Program Components: The program aims to achieve the above by working on the following:

Tutoring to break the barriers of inequality, reasoning, improving the level of knowledge and skills desired for mainstream education.

Encourage Reading in youth so that they become educated, dynamic and insightful, critical and aware citizens of the world.

Talking develops the ability to present their ideas and exchange information on controversial topics.

Lecturing provides access to varied information to the youth, helping them with their development and providing tools to increase their confidence and self-esteem, thus helping them achieve their goals.

Show movies as an entertaining activity for the youth to learn about people, culture, enhance their capacity for dialogue and interpretation, as well as bring about a greater understanding of different situations in a very complex world.

Story Telling: Awakening the desire for listening and learning in youth through storytelling.

Art Therapy: Work with the medium of art and creativity that helps in spurring imagination, development and expansion of creative potential of the youth aiding them to become an agent of transformation in their life.

Centre for Informatics: Offering the youth, space where they can learn to use the tools of the Internet for conducting research and equipping themselves better for the profession they wish to undertake.

Kumon: Discovering the potential of each individual, honing their skills to the best of their abilities, empowering them to become responsible citizens who shall contribute to the global community.

Learning English: Develop in students, the four English communication skills:

- Speaking
- Reading
- **Writing**
- Listening and comprehension

Professional Development: Involve the youth in activities that encourage access to knowledge and development of a future project, imparting comprehensive training and inculcating work ethics, values and behaviours necessary for surviving in the corporate world.

The toilets built by UPL Ltd. are as good as those found in big hotels. The facilities for upkeep and maintenance are also proving to be very useful. The various activities organized in our school are also helping children develop good hygiene practices from an early age.

The Dangs district is one of the poorest in Gujarat with the highest tribal population (98%). There is high migration as agriculture productivity is low. This affects both food and nutritional security. UPL has supported AKRSPI for the last 3 years in enhancing food security through promotion of SRI (System of Rice Intensification) which both enhances rice productivity but also uses fewer seeds and water. In addition, vegetable cultivation has been made possible for landless women through the promotion of landless gardens (vegetable cultivation in gunny bags). To ensure that crops do not over-use water, innovative low-cost drip irrigation has been piloted in addition to supporting farmers accessing drip from the government. Overall this support has been flexible, allowing AKRSPI to respond to the changing needs of the community and new innovations which emerge.

We Are United (WAU) Volunteers @ UPL Ltd.

Involvement of our employees in CSR initiatives is an integral component of our CSR thought process. We have designed a well-defined process to enable the employees to participate in the programs. The objective of the program is to take employee volunteering to UPL factory locations and offices in a structured manner.

The UPL CSR team co-ordinates with the WAU volunteers and helps them in using their talent and skills for the betterment of society and environment.




